#### **The Article**

English has two kinds of article: the definite article "the"; and the indefinite article "a". Greek has only one article. At this beginning stage of learning Greek it is possibly best to consider the Greek article as the equivalent of the definite article in English, although, there are some differences in how the two languages use the article.

The Greek article has case, gender, and number.

Nominative Masculine Singular: ò

Nominative Masculine Plural: oì

**Accusative Masculine Singular: τὸν** 

**Accusative Masculine Plural:** τοὺς
